FY 2022 Prevention Program Funding Opportunities

EBP, EPS and TCL mechanisms

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CPRIT: Funding (2007) and Reauthorization (2019)

- 2007 Texans voted overwhelmingly in favor of a constitutional amendment creating the Cancer Prevention and Research Institute of Texas (CPRIT) and funding with \$3 billion in general obligation bonds.
- 2019 A constitutional amendment was approved by Texas voters to authorize an additional \$3 billion in general obligation bond funds on behalf of CPRIT.
- Total is \$6 billion over 20 years

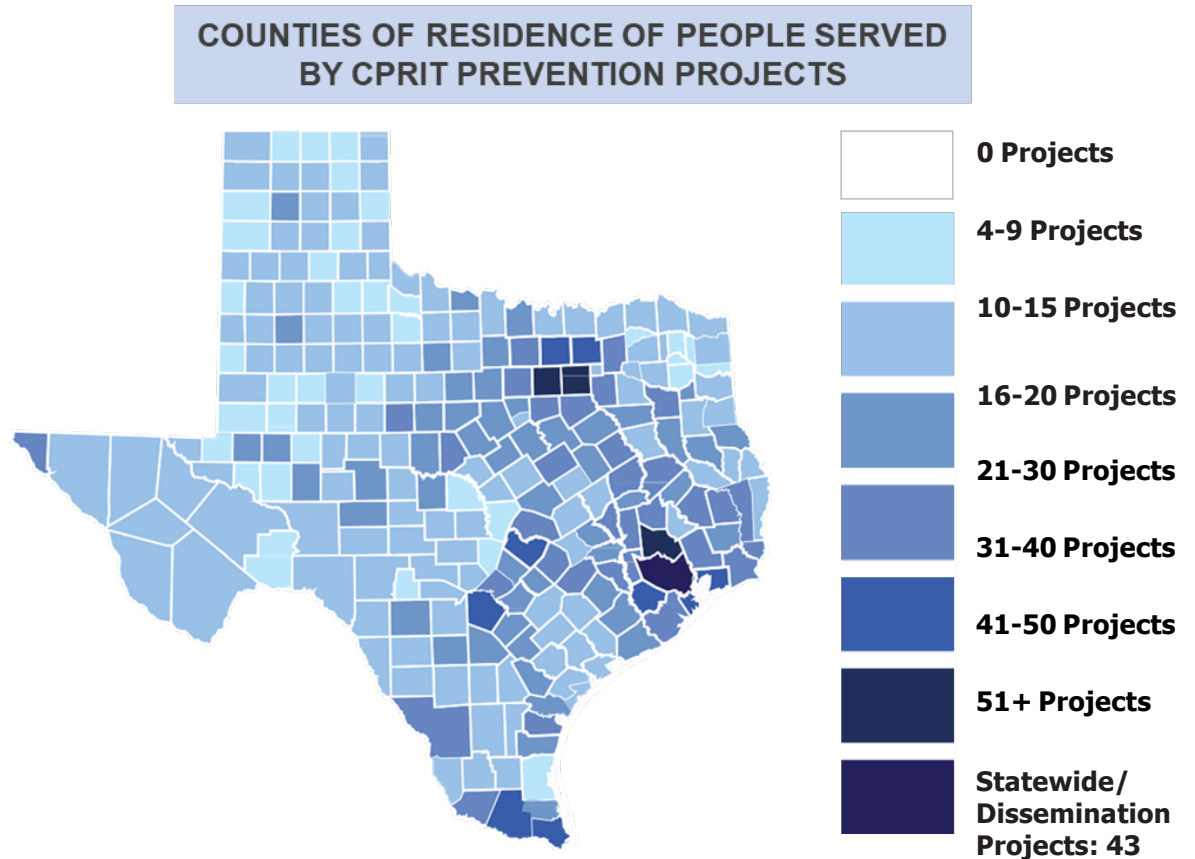
Prevention Services

➤ **7.1 million services** provided

➤ **3.9 million education and training services** for the public and professionals

➤ **3.2 million clinical services:**

- Breast, cervical, colorectal, lung screenings & diagnostics
- Hepatitis B & C screenings
- HPV & Hepatitis B vaccinations
- Tobacco cessation counseling and treatment
- Genetic testing and counseling
- Survivor programs and services



CPRIT has funded \$289 million for 249 prevention projects at 53 Texas organizations

FY 2022 Funding Opportunities – RFA Mechanisms

Expansion of Cancer Prevention Services to Rural and Medically Underserved Populations (Cycles 1 and 2)

Up to \$2 million for up to 36 months – first expansion

Up to \$2.5 million for up to 5 years – subsequent expansions

Evidence-Based Cancer Prevention Services

Up to \$1 million for up to 36 months

Tobacco Control and Lung Cancer Screening

Up to \$1 million for up to 36 months

Dissemination of CPRIT-Funded Cancer Control Interventions

Up to \$300,000 for up to 24 months

Prevention Program Assessment - *NEW*

Up to \$750,000 for up to 24 months

- Clinical service delivery to rural/MUA counties required
- Tobacco cessation/lung cancer screening should apply under TCL
- Always read Instructions (IFA)

- Apply under EPS for ALL expansions
- Initial or Maintenance
- Funding structure is variable
- Clinical service and Community Partner networks – strongly encouraged
- Always read the IFA

Cancer screenings/diagnostics	Initial	\$2 million	3 years
Cancer screenings/diagnostics	Maintenance	\$2.5 million	5 years
Healthy living/obesity control	Initial or Maintenance	\$1 million	3 years
HPV/hepatitis B screening and vaccination/hepatitis C screening	Initial	\$2 million	3 years
HPV/hepatitis B screening and vaccination/hepatitis C screening	Maintenance	\$2.5 million	5 years
Survivor care	Initial or Maintenance	\$1 million	3 years
Tobacco cessation	Initial or Maintenance	\$2 million	3 years
Lung cancer screening and tobacco cessation	Initial	\$2 million	3 years
Lung cancer screening and tobacco cessation	Maintenance	\$2.5 million	5 years



Expansions

- Restate the project and components; don't assume reviewers know or remember
- Justify/explain expansion plans & feasibility
- Report progress to date but also include projection of results in final year
- Tout your successes, capabilities, staff
- Differentiate between ongoing components and any new components, including counties served and # of services provided



Resubmissions – All Mechanisms

- One resubmission allowed
- Restate the project and components; don't assume reviewers know or remember
- Fully address summary statement weaknesses



Peer Review Evaluation Criteria

- Impact
- Project Strategy and Feasibility
- Outcomes Evaluation
- Organizational Qualifications and Capabilities
- Secondary – Budget and Dissemination



Multi-Stage Review Process

Peer Review

- Based on individual merit, not comparison

Programmatic Review

- ROI & impact, geography, cancer type, type of program in CPRIT portfolio

Program Integration Committee (PIC)

- Overall grant portfolio, budget

Oversight Committee

- Approve grant award recommendations



Ask Yourself

- Is your project both comprehensive and evidence-based – have you explained and referenced the evidence base?
- Does your project comply with established & current national guidelines and criteria?
- Have you made any assumptions in your application?
- Have you included baseline data or plan to collect baseline data?
- Have you explained how you **ensure access to treatment**?
- Is the evaluation plan fully developed and meaningful with measurable **OUTCOME** objectives? Does proposal answer **ALL** review criteria questions?
