CPRIT: Funding (2007) and Reauthorization (2019)

- 2007 Texans voted overwhelmingly in favor of a constitutional amendment creating the Cancer Prevention and Research Institute of Texas (CPRIT) and funding with \$3 billion in general obligation bonds.
- 2019 A constitutional amendment was approved by Texas voters to authorize an additional \$3 billion in general obligation bond funds on behalf of CPRIT.
- Total is \$6 billion over 20 years

CPRIT Grant Award Data

1,585 Awards Totaling \$2.67 Billion

Academic Research 1,311 awards, \$1.97 Billion Product Development 48 awards, \$465.6 Million

Prevention 249 awards, \$288.9 Million


Prevention Services

≻7.1 million services provided

➤ 3.9 million education and training services for the public and professionals

➤ 3.2 million clinical services:

- Breast, cervical, colorectal, lung screenings & diagnostics
- Hepatitis B & C screenings
- HPV & Hepatitis B vaccinations
- Tobacco cessation counseling and treatment
- Genetic testing and counseling
- Survivor programs and services



CPRIT has funded \$289 million for 249 prevention projects at 53 Texas organizations



One award; up to \$750,000, 24 months



Why did CPRIT issue this RFA?

- Measure program impact
- Identify best practices
- Tell the CPRIT story
- Support quality improvement
- Support future planning and priority setting

One award; up to \$750,000, 24 months



What do we hope to learn?

- Enhancement of infrastructure
- Extent of reach to underserved populations
- Improvements in selected endpoints (e.g., cancer risk reduction)
- Future data collection needs


Project Timeline

 Dissemination

- Secondary Budget and Dissemination

- ➤ Peer Review
 - Initial Review

- ➤ Program Integration Committee (PIC)
 - Overall CPRIT grant portfolio and budget
- Oversight Committee
 - Approve grant award recommendations
