REAL MOMENTUM III MEASURABLE RESULTS

The Cancer Prevention & Research Institute of Texas was created in 2007 when Texans voted to invest \$3 billion in a historic fight against cancer. Texas voters continued their support in 2019, when they overwhelmingly approved a constitutional amendment to provide an additional \$3 billion, making CPRIT a \$6 billion, 20-year initiative.

CPRIT awards grants for a wide variety of innovative cancer-related research, prevention and product development projects. **Houston-area benefits include:**

Investing in the research capabilities of Houston-area research entities

- ► \$1.46 billion in grants awarded to 12 Houston-area research entities
- ► 164 stellar researchers and their labs recruited to Houston-area research entities
- ► \$2.26 billion in direct follow-on funding raised by Houston-area CPRIT grantees
- ► Baylor College of Medicine achieved NCI comprehensive cancer center status joining The University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center
- ► 42 CPRIT core facility awards and renewals in the Houston area to provide access to cutting-edge shared technology through specialized instrumentation and technical expertise

Expand life science infrastructure by attracting companies to Houston & creating high-quality jobs

- ► 39 companies started, expanded, or brought to the Houston area with CPRIT investment totaling \$394.1 million
- ► 42 grants to CPRIT-funded Houston area companies with connections to Texas research institutions
- ▶ \$1.21 billion total expenditures statewide in 2023
- ▶ \$1.86 billion annual state and local tax receipts
- ▶ \$2.8 billion (7 to 1) direct follow-on funding raised by CPRIT companies
- ▶ Over 7,377 permanent jobs created in 2023 in Texas

Expedite innovation breakthroughs in prevention and cures

- ► 49,328 patients in 148 clinical trials or studies in the Houston area
- ➤ \$381 million in grants awarded for 303 prevention projects in all 254 Texas counties
- ► 44,751 cancers and cancer precursors detected by CPRIT-funded prevention projects
- ► Nationally recognized teams and centers in immunotherapy and childhood cancers
- ► 13 percent of CPRIT's portfolio goes to childhood cancer projects proportionally 3 times greater than federal commitment

Follow-on Funding Success

CPRIT-funded academic research grantees and companies in the Houston area raised \$5.07 billion in follow-on funds, exceeding contracted awards by \$1.86 billion
